## *Tardiness*

Tardiness may be acceptable in some social circles. However, it is considered slothfulness in the spiritual realm. The excuse, “He will be late for his own funeral” or “That’s just the way he is,” does not justify tardiness. Spiritual protocol requires “all things be done decently and in order” (I Cor. 14:40) and that includes arriving in a timely manner.

The truth is, punctuality is a matter of self-discipline mixed with thoughtful planning and properly placed priorities. These qualities will get you there on time, every time, unless providentially hindered.

## REVERENCE

Tardiness and reverence are opposites. We don’t talk much about “reverence” anymore. Maybe we should. Tardiness reflects lack of reverence. Reverence has to do with the degree of importance we place on spiritual things and events. Being on time for Bible Study or the Worship assembly shows that we regard God and His Word as important in our

lives.

## DISRUPTION

Have we considered the fact that tardiness disrupts those who have already started? It is next to impossible to sneak in unnoticed. When we arrive late, we can hardly avoid interrupting study and worship that is already in progress. We divert the worshipper's attention from the important matters at hand. They are forced to notice us, instead of concentrating on worship.

If for some reason beyond our control we find ourselves arriving late, we should stand near the door quietly until a prayer or song that is in progress is ended instead of disrupting others while trying to get to our seats. Logically, then, being on time honors God and shows respect for others.

## TEACHERS LATE??

Teachers especially need to be in their classrooms ahead of time to be fully ready from the first moment to give the students all that can be given them. Teachers are example setters in word and deed. Their enthusiasm can be catching.

## OPPORTUNITY IS LOST

Being tardy eliminates the opportunity to greet newcomers. A friendly greeting can help set the mood for an edifying Bible study and Worship period for visitors. It makes them feel at home. Wouldn't you agree?

## WHEN SHOULD I GET READY

There can be no argument against being prompt, read and eager to worship and praise God. Actually, Saturday is an excellent day in which to begin getting ready for Sunday. Why were the five foolish virgins in the parable of Jesus (Matthew 25:1-13) called foolish?

They that *were* foolish took their lamps, and took no oil with them: But the wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps.
